1. RATIONALE:

Anatomy drawing of female will help a student to represent fashion ideas on paper illustrating in various poses with the appropriate facial expressions. The texture and drape of the textile can be incorporated as per the actual outlook.

2. COMPETENCY:

The aim of the course is to help the student to attain the following industry identified competency through demonstrations, teaching and learning experiences.

• Render the fashion garments and accessories on a stylized human figure.

The student will be able to

- a. Illustrate using one-point perspective.
- b. Illustrate stylized human figures with different poses and expressions.
- c. Apply design detailing to garments.
- d. Develop individual style of illustration.
- e. Use wet and mixed medias for effective presentations.
- f. Illustrate using advanced perspective.

This course will emphasise on fleshed female illustrations. The student will be able to show styles, garment details through techniques of sketching and rendering.




Figure 1 - Course Map
